HOLLYWOOD ENDINGS

Luke 15:25-32 (NLT2)

²⁵ "Meanwhile, the older son was in the fields working. When he returned home, he heard music and dancing in the house, ²⁶ and he asked one of the servants what was going on. ²⁷ 'Your brother is back,' he was told, 'and your father has killed the fattened calf. We are celebrating because of his safe return.' 28 "The older brother was angry and wouldn't go in. His father came out and begged him, ²⁹ but he replied, 'All these years I've slaved for you and never once refused to do a single thing you told me to. And in all that time you never gave me even one young goat for a feast with my friends. 30 Yet when this son of yours comes back after squandering your money on prostitutes, you celebrate by killing the fattened calf!' 31 "His father said to him, 'Look, dear son, you have always stayed by me, and everything I have is vours. 32 We had to celebrate this happy day. For your brother was dead and has come back to life! He was lost. but now he is found!""

Luke 15:1-3 (NLT2)

¹ Tax collectors and other notorious sinners often came to listen to Jesus teach. ² This made the Pharisees and teachers of religious law complain that he was associating with such sinful people—even eating with them! ³ So Jesus told them this story...

I. The Older Brother Lost His Joy

Luke 15:25-28 (NLT2)

²⁵ "Meanwhile, the older son was in the fields working. When he returned home, he heard music and dancing in the house, ²⁶ and he asked one of the servants what was going on. ²⁷ 'Your brother is back,' he was told, 'and your father has killed the fattened calf. We are celebrating because of his safe return.' ²⁸ "The older brother was angry and wouldn't go in. His father came out and begged him...

There's no doubt that the older brother would have been angry at his younger brother for the way he left and for hurting their father.

Romans 12:15 (NKJV)

Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.

II. The Older Brother Lost His Focus

Luke 15:29-30 (NLT2)

²⁹ but he replied, 'All these years I've slaved for you and never once refused to do a single thing you told me to. And in all that time you never gave me even one young goat for a feast with my friends. ³⁰ Yet when this son of yours comes back after squandering your money on prostitutes, you celebrate by killing the fattened calf!'

The older brother's issue is that he's stuck playing the comparison game.

Luke 18:10-14 (NLT2)

10 "Two men went to the Temple to pray. One was a Pharisee, and the other was a despised tax collector. 11 The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed this prayer: 'I thank you, God, that I am not a sinner like everyone else. For I don't cheat, I don't sin, and I don't commit adultery. I'm certainly not like that tax collector! 12 I fast twice a week, and I give you a tenth of my income.' 13 "But the tax collector stood at a distance and dared not even lift his eyes to heaven as he prayed. Instead, he beat his chest in sorrow, saying,

'O God, be merciful to me, for I am a sinner.' ¹⁴ I tell you, this sinner, not the Pharisee, returned home justified before God. For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

III. The Older Brother Lost His Perspective

There is a belief that some Christians have - that the Gospel is important for salvation, but then we move on to other things as we grow.

Luke 15:31-32 (NLT2)

31 "His father said to him, 'Look, dear son, you have always stayed by me, and everything I have is yours. ³² We had to celebrate this happy day. For your brother was dead and has come back to life! He was lost, but now he is found!""

Ephesians 5:25 (NLT2)

^{25*} For husbands, this means love your wives, just as Christ loved the church. He gave up his life for her.
