LIVING IN A WORLD OF STRESS

2 Corinthians 1:3-10 (NKJV)

³Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, ⁴who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. ⁵For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also abounds through Christ. ⁶Now if we are afflicted, *it is* for your consolation and salvation, which is effective for enduring the same sufferings which we also suffer. Or if we are comforted, it is for your consolation and salvation. ⁷And our hope for you is steadfast, because we know that as you are partakers of the sufferings, so also you will partake of the consolation. For we do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, of our trouble which came to us in Asia: that we were burdened beyond measure, above strength, so that we despaired even of life. ⁹Yes, we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves but in God who raises the dead, ¹⁰who delivered us from so great a death, and does deliver us; in whom we trust that He will still deliver us... you and your sons live on the rest."

I. LOOK FOR A MINISTRY TO ENJOY

2 Corinthians 1:3-6 (NLT2)

All praise to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is our merciful Father and the source of all comfort. ⁴ He comforts us in all our troubles so that we can comfort others. When they are troubled, we will be able to give them the same comfort God has given us. 5 For the more we suffer for Christ, the more God will shower us with his comfort through Christ. ⁶ Even when we are weighed down with troubles, it is for your comfort and salvation! For when we ourselves are comforted, we will certainly comfort you. Then you can patiently endure the same things we suffer.

2 Corinthians 11:23-28 (NLT2)
23 Are they servants of Christ? I know I sound like a madman, but I have served him far more! I have worked harder, been put in prison more often, been whipped times without number, and faced death again and again. 24 Five different times the Jewish leaders gave me thirty-nine lashes. 25 Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked. Once I spent a whole night and a day adrift at sea. 26 I have traveled on many long journeys. I have faced danger from rivers and from robbers. I have faced danger from my own people, the Jews, as well as from the Gentiles. I have faced danger in the cities, in the deserts, and on the seas. And I have faced danger from men who claim to be believers but are not. ²⁷ I have worked hard and long, enduring many sleepless nights. I have been hungry and thirsty and have often gone without food. I have shivered in the cold, without enough clothing to keep me warm. ²⁸ Then, besides all this, I have the daily burden of my concern for all the churches.

II. LEAN ON SOMEONE FOR SUPPORT

2 Corinthians 1:7 (GW)

We have confidence in you. We know that as you share our sufferings, you also share our comfort.

Hebrews 10:25 (NLT2)

²⁵ And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another...

John 15:12 (NLT2)

¹² This is my commandment: Love each other in the same way I have loved you.

Galatians 6:2 (ESV)

III. LISTEN FOR A MESSAGE TO PASS ON

2 Corinthians 1:8-10 (NLT2)

⁸ We think you ought to know, dear brothers and sisters, about the trouble we went through in the province of Asia. We were crushed and overwhelmed beyond our ability to endure, and we thought we would never live through it. ⁹ In fact, we expected to die. But as a result, we stopped relying on ourselves and learned to rely only on God, who raises the dead. ¹⁰ And he did rescue us from mortal danger, and he will rescue us again. We have placed our

Proverbs 3:5-6 (NLT2)

Teddy Hodgson wrote: "The Lord Jesus illustrated and commended a Christianity that bent its back, soiled its hands and blistered its feet in stooping to help fallen man. Just as positively He denounced and condemned a professional religion that passes by on the other side

when man's need is at it greatest. Some are called to be Apostles, but every Christian is called to be an Epistle (A love letter of God, read of men.)"
