AMERICA'S PAST REVIVALS

Isaiah 64:1-5 (NKJV)

¹ Oh, that You would rend the heavens! That You would come down! That the mountains might shake at Your presence-- ² As fire burns brushwood, As fire causes water to boil-- To make Your name known to Your adversaries, *That* the nations may tremble at Your presence! ³ When You did awesome things *for which* we did not look, You came down, The mountains shook at Your presence. ⁴ For since the beginning of the world *Men* have not heard nor perceived by the ear, Nor has the eye seen any God besides You, Who acts for the one who waits for Him. ⁵ You meet him who rejoices and does righteousness, *Who* remembers You in Your ways. You are indeed angry, for we have sinned-- In these ways we continue; And we need to be saved.

Habakkuk 3:2 (AMP)

- ² O Lord, I have heard the report of You and was afraid. O Lord, revive Your work in the midst of the years, in the midst of the years make [Yourself] known! In wrath [earnestly] remember love, pity, *and* mercy.
- *Great Awakening in the 1730's related to Wesleyan Revival
- *Second Great Awakening in the 1820s in colleges and camp meetings
- *Prayer Revival in 1858 as America struggling over slavery

I. THE LORD COMES DOWN

Isaiah 64:1 (AMP)

OH, THAT You would rend the heavens and that You would come down, that the mountains might quake *and* flow down at Your presence—

E.M. Bounds: "What the Church needs today is not more machinery or better, not new organizations or more and novel methods, but men whom the Holy Ghost can use—men of prayer, men mighty in prayer. The Holy Ghost does not flow through methods, but through men. He does not come on machinery, but on men. He does not anoint plans, but men—men of prayer."

- *Considered by many scholars the greatest revival in all of history
- *God's chosen man—Evan Roberts
- *100,000 saved in just six months
- J. Edwin Orr: "Drunkenness was immediately cut in half, and many taverns went bankrupt. Crime was so diminished that judges were presented with white gloves signifying that there were no cases of murder, assault, rape or robbery or the like to consider. The police became unemployed in many districts. Stoppages occurred in coal mines, not due to unpleasantness between management and workers, but because so many foul-mouthed miners became converted and stopped using foul language that the horses which hauled the coal trucks in the mines could no longer understand what was being said to them."

Elmer Towns tells us how it affected the United States: 1. Morality greatly improved as drunkenness and all types of sin were greatly reduced. 2. Political reform was enacted as corrupt politicians were removed from office. 3. Many young people volunteered as missionaries to foreign lands where hospitals and schools were built. 4. A number of Pentecostal denominations were begun.

II. THE PEOPLE OF GOD SUBMIT

Isaiah 64:1-2 (AMP)

¹ OH, THAT You would rend the heavens and that You would come down, that the mountains might quake *and* flow down at Your presence—² As when fire kindles the brushwood and the fire causes the waters to boil—to make Your name known to Your adversaries, that the nations may tremble at Your presence!

- 1. Mountains melt at Your presence.
- 2. Sinners will tremble before Him.

III. THE RIGHTEOUS REJOICE

Isaiah 64:5 (AMP)

You meet *and* spare him who joyfully works righteousness (uprightness and justice), [earnestly] remembering You in Your ways. Behold, You were angry, for we sinned; we have long continued in our sins [prolonging Your anger]. And shall we be saved?

*Baby Boomer Jesus People Revival of 1960s

Asbury President Kinlaw said: "You may not understand this, but the only way I know how to account for this is that last Tuesday morning, about twenty of eleven, the Lord Jesus walked into Hughes Auditorium, and he's been there ever since, and you've got the whole community paying tribute to his presence."
